The conference saw the participation of all the 5 CABCIN European member nations, including participants from the Indian Universities, and other Asian nations the likes Bhutan. Commencing the conference after an auspicious visit to the Sai temple in the university campus a grand cultural performance by a South Korean native folk dance group. Technical Sessions

Out of a total of two hundred abstracts submitted across India and various European countries from which a total of one hundred and fifty of them selected based on a thorough research based criteria. A total of 58 papers were presented by the national and international researchers throughout this two day International conference, exploring an in depth knowledge in regards to academics. Chairing the first sessions of the conference were DR Mohit Patel, Dr. Preeti Nair, Dr Sridevi Xaviers, Prof. Nikoletta Christodoulou, Dr. Martin Valcke, Prof. Marianna Sinicakova, and Prof Jan Beluca. The second technical session conducted on the second day of the conference saw the successful delivery of the papers with Dr. Vivek Jaglan, Prof. Agnieszka Bienkowska, Prof. Joao Correia de Freitas, Dr Patricia Pinto Isabel Nunes as the chairs.









Highlight Of The Themes

Focussing on the sub theme New Trends in Training Methods, Approaches and Tools Under this theme total 13 papers were presented with Mr. Mohit Patel and Jan Beluca and Isabel Nunes as the chairs. EQ is taken care of in a right way, Interdisciplinary teaching will aid the instructors in improving the teaching learning process. The blended teaching approach will enhance equity and excellence, as well as employability skills.

Regarding, Teaching with Technology the diversified papers under the chairing of Dr. Sridevi Xaviers,Mr Vivek Jaglan, Prof. Joao Correia de Freitas and Mr Martin Valcke papers presented under this theme include, technology enabled teaching and learning methodologies and practices. Right from the software usages such as customized ESL, Hot Potatoes Augmented Reality, 3D Printing and Game based learning then mobile and apps in research were discussed as the mandatory teaching aids that can be

Another topic of interest which saw a keen participation of the international researchers was in the area Developing Trainers' Soft Skills. Under this theme 9 papers were presented in the interactive sessions, and to chair these knowledge sharing platforms was Prof. Nickoletta Christolodou and Dr. Vivek Jaglan. The researchers conducted effective on how the enhancement of soft skills development among teachers, and the use of online resources for this establishment.

Teaching Assessment was also an area of interest in this conference and a total of 10 papers were presented under the chairing of Prof. Marianna Agnieszka Bienkowksa. This provided a unique outcome through well research information regarding the essential mode of assessment. Assessment is the heart of higher education and its impact is what ensures performance, familiarity with different assessment methods, was advised to be conducted along with the satisfaction of students on various factors and Indicators Survey of Work Package 2.

Objectives

The main outcome which CABCIN desires to accomplish is the strengthening of the capacity and quality of teaching in partner Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs) of India through the establishment of Capacity Building Centres (CBCs). The target of establishing the Capacity Building Centres is designed to offer an initial and continuous training for current and future university teachers, paying particular attention to the promotion of innovative teaching methods. The Capacity Building Centres also focus on making the teachers within these Universities develop the necessary information and communication technology skills (ICTs). This will be done through preparing a select group of trainers to conduct high-quality and innovative training, as well as e-learning courses, deliver feedback and resources to make excellent teaching possible.

Specific Project Objectives

- To create a campus-wide teaching culture through the establishment of Capacity Building Centres with open and flexible access to its e-learning resources
- To build own capacity by preparing selected staff towards the training for academics
- To develop a map of key teaching competencies in order to design tailor-made courses for current and future university teaching staff
- To develop key self-regulation and self-managing competencies for teaching staff in order to overcome the obstacles that they face during the teaching process by preparing teaching programs with a focus on pedagogical skills.
- To enlarge the number of trained staff by implementing innovative blended courses with ICT use
- To create possibilities of applying gained skills and building international teaching and research networks by fostering European Visiting Program
